The Homebound Reader Service is a free program specifically designed for those who are confined to their homes by an illness or an injury, either temporary or long term. You must be homebound and live in the City of Long Beach in order to qualify for this service.

The Long Beach Public Library offers a diverse and wide selection of books, magazines, and other materials in many different formats and languages. A professional librarian selects materials based on your reading interests. Your selections are mailed to your place of residence on a two-week schedule. The library also provides prepaid return postage to return the materials to us.
